The **International Youth Research Training Seminar** on young people's ethnic, European and other identities has been prepared but was not implemented yet. The syllabus, developed by Natalia Waechter and Lyudmila Nurse, contains several lectures and workshops led by (current and former) board members of the RC34: Howard Williamson, Ladislav Machacek, Lyudmila Nurse, Natalia Waechter, and Claire Wallace. It is planned to take place at CEU in 2015.

Regarding <u>incoming amounts</u>, above all, we have received the **RC34 dues** and the **ISA grant** in two instalments.

- In May 2011 we received 1,546 € from ISA Madrid (= US\$ 1,500 RC34 dues + US\$ 700 first instalment ISA grant),
- in March 2012 we received **413.75** € from the "RC04 & RC34 Conference on Transitions" in Tampa, Florida
- and in December 2012 we received **2,640** € from ISA Madrid (= US\$ **2,015** RC34 dues for the period 13 May 2001 to 10 December 2012 + US\$ **700** second instalment ISA grant¹ + US\$ **725** grants increased approved by ISA RCC).

Regarding <u>outgoing amounts</u>, we have used the budget for **promotion and dissemination** as well as for **supporting junior scholars**.

- For promotion and dissemination, in 2011 we spent 530 € on the IBYR newsletter and the same amount (530 €) on printing and mailing the new RC34 folders; in 2013 we spent 520 € on the IBYR newsletter.
- The junior scholar prize was given to Dan Woodman (688.68 € in August 2010) and a travel grant to the 2012 Forum to Siri Hettige (614,66 € = 750 US\$ in September 2012).

Since April 1, 2014, the actual balance is 7,674.42 €.

The following comment from our VP for Central and South America is passed on for information purposes:

"related to the relatively low number of RC34 members of Central and South America it is worthwhile to mention that when some researchers were asked about the reasons for not adhering to the RC, the most frequent response was related to the difficulties of language and the fact that most RC activities are conducted in English, even when Spanish is also an official language of ISA."
